3 Great Program Options:

Health Careers Shadow Day at Fletcher Allen



Job shadows happen during a Shadow Day or a MedQuest session.

A one-day program that takes place at Fletcher Allen Health Care. *Shadow Day* is designed to provide students with the opportunity to develop comfort in the health care field, shadow a health care professional in his/her work setting (one 2-3 hour job shadow), and to explore, as well as strengthen skills and resources, needed for such a career. Students will also receive confidentiality and infection control training, and interactive presentations by health care professionals.

Costs: \$25, if selected

(some scholarship funds available)

Lunch provided, but transportation is not.

Am I eligible?:

- if you live in Chittenden County
- in grade 10, 11, or 12
- can participate the whole day: 7:15-3:30pm

Complete application due **March 28th, 2012!** (including one letter of recommendation)

Focus on Health Careers Conference

A one-day conference for high school students who are interested in learning more about the health care field. This conference will give students the opportunity to explore health careers in high demand in Vermont, interact with health care professionals and students to learn what work and study are really like, learn strategies and resources to make the best of high school opportunities, prepare for the transition to college, and much more. The conference is held at the University of Vermont's College of Medicine.

Am I eligible?:

- if you live in Addison, Franklin, Grand Isle or Chittenden Counties
- in grade 9, 10, 11, or 12
- can participate the whole day: 8:30-4:30pm

MedQuest Health Careers Exploration Program

A rigorously structured, educational, week-long, and residential program that is held on the UVM campus, providing students with the opportunity to explore a variety of careers in health care while gaining comfort in a college environment. Students will receive confidentiality and infection control training. Through interactive presentations and a job shadowing experience at each of the three local hospitals or within the communities, students strengthen their leadership skills, learn about community and continuing education resources, and develop a clearer understanding of the health care field and how they can enter into such a career.

June or July sessions in 2012

Costs: \$500, if selected

(some scholarship funds available)

Meals and housing provided.

Am I eligible?:

- if you live in Addison, Franklin, Grand Isle, or Chittenden Counties
- in grade 11 or 12
- interested in living in a UVM dorm and experiencing college life
- can participate the whole week, either:
Session I: June 24th—June 29th, 2012
OR
Session II: July 8th—July 13th, 2012

Complete application due **February 10th, 2012!** (including two letter of recommendation)
