The Community

[St. Albans, Vermont](#), located 29 miles north of Burlington, is a community of approximately 13,000 residents. St. Albans is located in the heart of Franklin County, which is the largest milk-producing county in New England, the top agricultural county in Vermont, and the largest maple-producing county in the United States. St. Albans has maintained the charm of a rural community while growing into the region's industrial center. It has many excellent restaurants, a public library, numerous churches, drug stores, convenience stores, and grocery stores. St. Albans borders Lake Champlain and during the summer months the population of the area greatly increases with the influx of summer residents.



Hospital Affiliation

The doctors of St. Albans Primary Care are affiliated with the [Northwestern Medical Center](#) (NMC), a 70-bed not-for-profit, primary care hospital located on Fairfield Street in St. Albans. NMC is a high-tech facility that works hard to preserve the "family feel" of a rural hospital while delivering high quality health care to the community.

The office staff consists of three physicians, two physician assistants, three licensed practical nurses, and multiple other administrative/support staff.



Typical Day

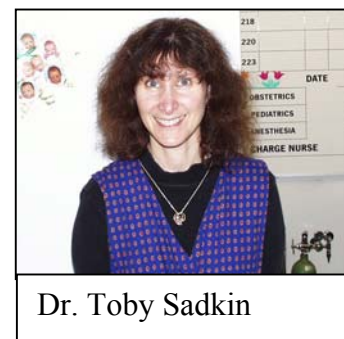
When there are patients at NMC, days start with hospital rounds followed by patient visits in the office. Patients encountered includes both children and adults, with varying conditions and needs including: OB, chronic and acute illness, injuries and those requiring various office procedures such as: suturing, splinting, casting, cyst removal, coposcopy and endometrial biopsy.

Teaching Goals

Dr. Sadkin's hope is that students learn something new every day so that they leave the rotation knowing more than they did at the start. She feels it's important for students to gain an appreciation for the uniqueness of family practice and how the continuity of care helps establish a strong doctor/patient relationship and lends insights that enhance the physician's ability to care for the patient.
